

Tour and Studio Workshops

\$8 + HST per student | 15 participant minimum, 30 participant maximum

A one-hour interactive tour of the current exhibitions plus a one-hour hands-on art making workshop. All sessions integrate with the Ontario Curriculum; open to all grades. Morning and afternoon sessions are available.

Fall 2016

Large scale environmental photographs by Edward Burtynsky encourage viewers to consider the impact humanity has on local and global environments. During the studio workshop students will experiment with collage techniques, creating multi-layered compositions that address shape and scale.



Winter 2017

Kent Monkman's paintings often reposition North American Indigenous people within the Euro-centric canon of art history, turning our understanding of Canadian identity on its head. Students will have the opportunity to transform well-known works of art by adding irreverent elements from contemporary culture.

Early Spring 2017

Join us for the annual exhibition of student artwork from the Waterloo Region. This year's theme, *Spin, Twist, Shift*, encourages participants and viewers to "consider all the angles" and see things from a new perspective. In this workshop students will experiment with gesture and movement. Late Spring 2017

New work by Joseph Tisiga and Maggie Groat will demonstrate the role that signs and symbols play in defining cultures. Students will use a variety of media to generate their own inventory of shapes and symbols to define who they are.

KWAG 2 GO: Single Visit

\$6 + HST per student 15 participant minimum

Students will view an image from KWAG's Permanent Collection as they are guided through an active viewing exercise. This is followed by an art making activity connected to the discussion by theme and media. Content for each presentation is tied to grade-specific curriculum:

Host a local artist in your classroom! One of KWAG's artist educators will present images of their recent work and answer questions about life as an artist.

KWAG 2 GO: Three Part Program

\$14 + HST per student 15 participant minimum, 30 participant maximum

Our three part program consists of two in-school sessions and one Tour and Studio Workshop at the gallery. During the pre-visit in your classroom students practice careful observation, learn about interpreting a work of art, and create their own artwork using what they learned as inspiration. The Tour and Studio Workshop encourages students to practice their observation skills in the gallery and includes a one hour hands-on art making experience in our studio. This is followed by a post-visit consolidation lesson in your classroom and a final art making activity to extend their learning into new realms.

Local teens meet at the Gallery every other week throughout the school year to learn more about the art world, meet like-minded peers, and earn volunteer hours.
